President's Message

Let's Make a Difference in a Girl's Life!

I am fortunate enough to live right next door to the University of San Diego, and I have often taken advantage of the opportunity to listen to nationally renowned speakers who come to campus. Over the years, I have seen the Dalai Lama, author Colson Whitehead, and former Attorney General Edwin Meese speak. One speaker who made a great impression on me was 2011 Nobel Laureate Leymah Gbowee. She was the Keynote Spea ker at the International Women's Day Breakfast in 2013, and her story is amazing.

In 2003, Gbowee led a nonviolent demonstration of Christian and Muslim women with the goal of ending the 14-year civil war in Liberia. The women sat daily at the hotel where the peace talks were going on. These women threatened to rip off their clothes in front of these men if they didn't end the war. According to Gbowee,



it's a curse to see a married or elderly woman bare herself. The women sat outside the room until the men inside began to negotiate seriously, and in August 2003, there was a peace accord.

I saved the program from the breakfast, and I wrote down a quote from Leymah Gbowee. She said, "We need to quit talking to ourselves. Take one girl in your community and mentor her." And she said, "Nothing about us without us." This is the power of women and the power of AAUW. We mentor girls all of the time, starting with Tech Trek. Another example is the recent Ed Equity Global Challenge led by Shauna Ruyle. Let's keep doing our wonderful work of breaking through barriers for women and girls.

AAUW California Decries Discrimination against Black Transgender and Gender Non-conforming People

AAUW California supports "freedom in definition of self-identity" as critical to ensuring justice for a diverse and inclusive society. One group that is consistently denied this freedom is black transgender and gender non-conforming individuals. Over the past several years, increasing attention has been focused on the multitude of ways in which these individuals encounter marginalization and discrimination. A recent study by the National Center for Transgender Equality addressed these forms of discrimination through the National Transgender Discrimination Survey. The study highlighted a variety of economic, safety, and physical and mental health challenges faced by transgender and gender non-conforming individuals. Black transgender people had unemployment rates four times the rate of the general population and twice the rate of transgender people at large. A startling 41% of black transgender or gender non-conforming individuals said they had experienced being unsheltered. Black transgender individuals suffered extreme poverty at a rate of 31% which is twice that of transgender individuals of all races and eight times the general US population. Furthermore, 50% of black respondents who attended school while expressing their transgender identity or gender nonconformity reported harassment in the survey. Nearly half of black respondents to the survey had attempted to commit suicide and more than 20% were living with HIV compared to 0.60% of the general population. The findings highlight the profound challenges faced by black transgender and gender non-conforming individuals and point to the need for social justice advocates and government officials to address the intersection between race and gender identity to assure equity of transgender or gender non-conforming citizens.

AAUW members can address the challenges faced by black transgender and gender nonconforming individuals by advocating for legislation that assures an even playing field and addresses the unique housing and healthcare challenges faced by this population. These will

help us achieve AAUW-California's public policy goals of equality, inclusiveness, and financial security for all women.


