The AAUW San Diego Board of Directors helped make this a wonderful year, even though we were stuck at home most of the time.

Our programs for the year were inspiring and full of important information. In September, we heard from Paulette McWilliams and Toni Lopez about "Racism in Our Society". They experienced not only racism but also sexual harassment. In October, we co-sponsored a Zoom meeting with the La Mesa-El Cajon Branch and learned from our own Tristan Higgins, "Just How Many Genders Are There?"

In November, Ellen Arcadi, a member of the California Senior Assembly, spoke to us about legislative issues that are important to senior citizens.

In December, we had a musical interlude from guitarist and vocalist, Lorraine Theresa, and we also heard from Tracy Quezada, an AAUW Fellow, who is making a film about sexual abuse of children.

The new year began with an IBC presentation about "Mental Health and Wellness During COVID-19". In February, Maria Lupetini took us through her presentation, "Artificial Intelligence and Amazon Alexa". Since March was Women's History Month, we were fortunate enough to hear from our own Anne Hoiberg about "The Women's Liberation Movement: The Second Wave".

In April, we focused on equity and featured Dr. Hei-ock Kim, whose topic was "Gender Equity – Let's Get There Faster". In May, we supported other branches by attending their author events. And in June, we featured our scholarship winners, plus we had our officers installed by Kathleen Doty, Past President of AAUW California.

Our branch members also gave generously to help with our mission of breaking through barriers for women and girls. We gave over \$6,000 to AAUW Fund, \$5,000 to local scholarships, and \$10,000 to the Global Amazon Alexa Skills Challenge, to be used for scholarships.
