Wells has been in the news, because Mattel is coming out with a new Barbie doll based on her, but Ida B. Wells is a very important woman to learn about because of her history, not because she is now a Barbie doll.



Ida B. Wells was born into slavery in 1862 but was freed by the Emancipation

Proclamation. She worked for a while as a teacher, but she soon found her calling as a journalist. As co-owner of the "Memphis Free Speech and Headlight" newspaper, she wrote about racial inequality and particularly worked hard to expose the lynching of Black people.

She was one of the co-founders of the NAACP, and she also worked to help women obtain suffrage. This is a woman who made a difference in the lives of other women and in the lives of Black people.

Such a resolution will revitalize AAUW in a changing society and enrich the experience of our members. Designating a branch DEI contact and sharing that name with the state office at office@aauw@ca.org will assist the DEI Committee in its efforts to communicate through the inter-branch councils and with every branch in California.

Many of us find comfort in likeness and tend to hang out with folks like ourselves. This coming year brings many opportunities to move beyond that comfort zone and appreciate living in a multi-cultural society where differences between people are a valued asset.
