

Tech Trek campers for 2024 AAUW-San Diego has selected three girls to attend this year's Tech Trek camp

at UC San Diego, June 23-28. Tech Trek is a summer camp for middle school girls that focuses on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics). Campers spend one

week on a university campus; they live in the dorms, eat in the cafeteria, attend labs and classes, and learn what it might be like to be a college student.




women STEM professionals and receive guidance to help them prepare for

Tech Trek's goal is to ignite an existing spark of interest in STEM, so enthusiasm for STEM is one of the qualifications, along with a student's access, or lack of, to other enrichment programs, and evidence of curiosity and potential.



Bylaws vote closes May 15 Online voting is open until 9:00 a.m. PDT, May 15 on a proposed bylaws amendment on the AAUW National ballot that would eliminate the degree requirement. This amendment, if passed, will fully open membership to anyone who supports AAUW's work. This has been voted on once before. In 2021, 63 percent of members voted in favor of the amendment, however, it required a two-thirds (67.7 percent) vote to pass. Throughout AAUW's 143-year history, members have voted on a handful of issues to better advocate for our mission. We know there may be strong feelings regarding this membership topic.
